

Describe the events of Fédon's Rebellion (4)

2nd March 1795

- Fédon and his forces surrounded the town of Grenville
- Crying Liberté, égalité ou la mort! (Freedom, equality or death)
- They captured and put to death eleven of the British residents
- In Gouyave another group captured an additional 40 hostages
- The Governor of Grenada was included in this group (Ninian Home)
- They were held for over a month at Fédon's Estate (Belvidere)

3rd March

 The group of rebels grew to include more French planters, free men and enslaved people

8th April

- Unsuccessful assault on the rebel camp
- Fédon executed 48 captives in revenge
- The government tried to cut off supplies by controlling the ports

March 1796

 British took control of Post Royal and Pilot Hill, cutting off supplies of food and weapons

19th June

- British reinforcements arrived and the rebels positions were captured
- 50 rebels captured and found guilty of high treason
- 14 were publicly executed
